LETTER OF INTENT BETWEEN BHESCo and _____ (“ Supplier”),

hereafter referred to as (“the Parties)

With reference to the Anaerobic Digestion project (“the Project”)

This is a nonbinding agreement needed to demonstrate the amount of food waste that BHESCo can collect on an annual basis to its funders, thereby verifying the viability of our project.

BHESCo is a not for profit Co-operative with a mission to eradicate fuel poverty by processing locally produced food waste to biomethane. BHESCo is planning the construction of an Anaerobic Digestion plant that would process 35,000 tonnes of organic waste per annum on a designated waste site. Our intention is to deliver low cost heating on a utility scale to Brighton & Hove residents struggling to heat their homes. Since the plant will be designed to operate for 25 years, we are looking to pursue long term relationships with our fuel suppliers.

In its role of founding member of Community Energy South, BHESCo has developed a special relationship with a licensed energy supplier, Our Power, with whom we offer a local community energy tariff. The project intends to deliver green gas through a local network to households, offering fair prices and excellent service, all in a community owned energy supply model.

BHESCo is currently working through various ideas of the benefits that we can offer for your participation in the project, including equity in our Anaerobic Digestion plant based on the amount of food waste you are able to provide on an annual basis. At a minimum, we expect to be able to charge a small, nominal amount to collect the food waste from your premises.

Please indicate the amount of food waste you expect to generate _____ kg per month/year.

The Supplier agrees to allow BHESCo, via its designated waste collection company, Brighton Paper Round, to collect its food waste on a periodic basis, to be determined by the Supplier, starting no later than January 2019, in order to provide the fuel for the Anaerobic Digestion Plant. The Supplier acknowledges that this date may be shortened or lengthened depending on the timelines for the project.

Subject to meeting all necessary legal and regulatory requirements, the parties aim to commence plant operations in April 2019.
